You will do your review in groups of 3 students. You will be randomly assigned a test to review. Your group should prepare a written review (no more than 2 pages, single-spaced) that addresses the points below. The review should be emailed to me no later than February 18.

Age & Purpose

- 1. When was the test developed? Is this a problem?
 - There is nothing wrong in principle with older tests but items may no longer be appropriate and it raises questions about adequacy of the norms.
- 2. What is the purpose of the test?
 - screening, diagnosis, or both?
 - assessment of phoneme errors, phonological processes/patterns, or something else?

Administration

- 1. How long does it take to give and score the test?
 - The manual may give you a time estimate. If it doesn't, come up with your own.
- 2. Describe the procedure for administering the test.
 - How do you elicit responses from the child?
 - How do you record his responses?
- 3. Describe the procedure for scoring the test.
 - binary scoring, weighted scoring, or something else?
 - What kind of forms are used to help you interpret the results?

Norms

- 1. Is the test norm-referenced or criterion-referenced?
- 2. What is the age range of the norms?
- 3. Does the normative sample represent a particular population, or the US population as a whole?
- 4. Are the normative tables easy to use?
- 5. How are the norms expressed? (standard scores, percentile ranks, etc.)

Stimulability Testing

1. Does the test have a specific procedure for measuring stimulability?
